Secondly; a world-wide listing of all places having relevance to Newman genealogy and family history. Thirdly; specifics of study giving a brief outline of researcher's study, and fourthly; a list of related researchers.

For everyone to obtain the maximum benefit from the NGR it needs to be as accurate and up to date as possible. Therefore can I ask everyone to check their entry in the Seventh Edition and if appropriate send me their latest details.

Historical Records of Australia Vol. 1/XX1 Charles NEWMAN, Major, 2nd Battn. Native Infantry, East India Company

In a despatch from Sir George Gipps (the then Governor of the Colony of New South Wales) to Lord John Russell dated July, 1841 (acknowledge and answered by Lord Stanley 8 Jan. 1842)

In this letter a second letter was enclosed which had been written by Major Charles NEWMAN late of 2nd Battalion, of Native Infantry in the East India Company's service at Madras. The enclosure was not the original but a copy, the original having been sent previously by Major Newman direct to Lord Russell.

The case, simply stated, was that Major NEWMAN had applied for remission of the purchase price of some land in the Colony (N.S.W.) Major Newman had '...;quitted the military service in India in September 1834 and his first application for remission of purchase price for land in this Colony was made from Van Dieman's Land in January 1838 and his second application was made from Port Phillip on 29 July 1839, nearly 5 years having elapsed since Major NEWMAN left the army....'.

The application was disallowed on the grounds that officers were given special consideration when purchasing land in the Colony, provided they arrived in the Colony within one year after the date of their leaving the Army. Confirmation of the refusal to grant 'remission of purchase' came in a letter from Lord Stanley to Sir George Gipps dated at Downing Street, 8 January 1842.
