I have been looking for information on my g grandmother for over a year now. What info I have is what my mother has told me. I looked for a Sarah NUNLEY for a long time before my mother told me she was called 'Sallie'. Then I was able to find her marriage record on Familysearch.org. She was born in Kentucky (do not know for sure). Her father was a minister in the baptist church and gave land to the Masons in Kentucky. (all from my mother)

Sallie Nunley married Wm Michael Neuman on December 25, 1873 in Boone County, Missouri. This info is from Recorder of Deeds.

They lived in the Centralia, Boone Co., Missouri area. They had seven children. First child: Lennie Story Newman b. Oct. 26, 1877 m. Alfred Atkinson Bowe June 11, 1896 in St. Louis, Mo. d. 1952 in Cincinnati, Ohio. My grandmother. Five boys- no birth dates- not sure of names- but named for Confederate Generals. Emmett Newman, James Newman Kirby Smith Newman, Terry Newman, Trick Newman Last child was: Edna Jessie Newman b. Nov 16, 1889 m. Harry Mosinghoff in St. Louis, Missouri. d. April, 1984 in St. Louis, Mo.

Sallie was widowed and remarried a nephew of Robert E. Lee. At some time she moved to St. Louis and died around 1921 to 1923. She is buried in St. Louis. I don't know where.

I am making a family tree research trip to several states and hope to find some more information. If anyone has an information about any of the people above please contact me at my email address.

Evacuee Roller-Skates Home and Back

Thirteen-year-old Ronald Newman, an evacuee from Poplar, who is billeted at Datchet, Bucks, wanted to go home to spend a day with his parents.

He is keen on roller skating, so he decided that nothing would be more pleasurable than skating home. On Thursday morning last week he went out on his skates, and unbeknown to anybody, sped all the way to Poplar, spent a few hours there, and returned by the same method to Datchet late at night. He covered on the two journeys about sixty miles.

Ronald went to school as usual on Friday none the worse for his little trip.

Did he really do it? Can you imagine his parents waving him goodbye for the return trip! And how smooth were the roads for roller skating? Besides, being mid winter it must have been pitch black especially in the black-out.

The third fleet of 11 ships arrived in 1791, with over 2000 convicts. The newspaper report states that 194 male convicts and 4 female convicts died during the voyage, and that though conditions on board ship weren't as "diabolical" as the previous year, they were still outrageous. The convicts from Ireland who arrived on board the "Queen" are not included in the newspaper lists. As before, the list was compiled in London as so there is no way of knowing which people died on the voyage out, or did not leave England for any reason.

One male Newman who arrived in Van Diemens Land (now Tasmania) Australia, as a convict, was a William Newman, who arrived on the "Princess Charlotte", I have no further information on where and when he was tried. The "Princess Charlotte" arrived in VDL on 9 November 1824 carrying 140 male convicts. He married and had several children in Tasmania, but I don't know whether anyone is researching that family. He had a brother John Newman who also lived in the Henry Co. area, and perhaps also a brother named Joseph Newman who died in Patrick Co. in 1814.

This John Newman is quite likely the same John Newman found in Stokes Co., NC records in the 1790s and until about 1805. He was a Baptist minister.

On his birth certificate it states Hornchurch, Essex. Rumour has it that CH was in the Navy or Merchant Navy when he arrived in NZ c1874, and that he returned to sea in 1881 when his partner Louisa died giving birth to their 5th child in five years. In 1891 CH signs his daughter's marriage certificate (May Ehtel0.

Mr Alf Haley, 'Finches', Anchor Road, Tiptree, Colchester, Essex C05 0BS, has Two 'JOICES' who mrd NEWMAN's Mary marrying John Newman at Gt Saling, 1765 and John marrying Diana (Dinah) Newman in White Notley 1800.
